- What is the purpose of the QAQC visit?
 - 2 or 3 Day Visit to individual conservation district
 - Insure Program standards are being upheld.
 - Review of program funding / expenditures
 - Educational and feedback opportunity for District Staff.

 2 Categories – Administration /Functionality and Projects

 Commendations, Recommendations, and Required Actions

 "Unacceptable", "Doesn't Meet Expectations", "Meets Expectations", "Exceeds Expectations", or "Exceptional"

Commendations

- Items that the QAQC Team feel deserve Commendations (Sunshine Act, QAB members visit sites, good projects)

Recommendations

- Recommendations that may improve the program but are not required (more outreach, copy of QAB/board minutes in file)

Required Actions

 Things that are required to be completed. Will follow up to ensure these have been completed. (policies, accounting, DSA certs)

Evolution of QAQC's

- Round 3 included a much more in depth review of finances
 - Quarterly report reviews
 - QuickBooks / documentation of expenses
- Higher focus on stream crossings
 - Round 2 saw few installations
 - Round 3 they were much more common
- Combined Admin & Functionality into one section





- 5 Exceptional, 20 Exceeds, 35 Meets, 7 Doesn't Meet
- Previous Round
 - Admin (10 Exceeds, 46 Meets, 2 Doesn't)
 - Functionality (21 Exceeds, 36 Meets, 1 Doesn't)




Administration / Functionality

- I Exceptional, 14 Exceeds, 47 Meets, 4 Doesn't Meet
- Previous Round Project
 - (11 Exceeds, 47 Meets, 0 Doesn't Meet)

- Previous Round
 - (11 Exceeds, 54 Meets, 0 Doesn't)



What are the Districts doing that <u>exceed</u> expectations?

Going above and beyond what is required

- Construction Oversight
 - Not only being onsite, but ensuring program standards are upheld.
 - Correcting improper installations
- Preapp/Precon meeting for every project
 - Incorporate ideas to improve applications / workplans
- Outreach and Education
 - Personal visit to each municipality
- Exceptional Financial Tracking
- Very good drainage projects / phased with DSA / Comprehensive
- Making the program a priority

What are the Districts doing that <u>don't meet</u> expectations?

Financial Issues

- Documentation / Reporting / Tracking issues
- Using program funds to purchase items for other programs
- Abusing Admin/Edu funds
- Administrative Functionality Issues
 - Lack of construction oversight
 - Limited outreach / education
 - Not ensuring program policy is met

- Funding projects outside of policy (Repeated Issue or Several Projects)
 - Stream crossings (< bankfull, multiple pipes)</p>
 - 2A surface material
 - Off right of way issues
 - Funding only DSA with no drainage improvements

Commendations

Most Common Admin/Functionality Commendations:

- Good District Staff (82%)
 - Dedicated to the success of the program
 - Active in the program / attends training regularly
 - Administers the program effectively
- Preapplication / Preconstruction Meetings occur for every project (23%)
- Financial Reporting / Tracking is well organized and easy to follow (34%)

Most Common Admin/Functionality Commendations:

- Good working relationship with: (52%)
 - Project participants
 - SCC, CDGRS, TU, etc.
- Hard files are well organized and contain all necessary documentation (49%)
- QAB active and enthusiastic

Most Common Project Commendations:

- Good Project(s) / Comprehensive workplans / Implement a variety of ESM practices (77%)
- <u>Good Project locations / located in areas with clear</u> <u>environmental impacts</u>
- Good headwalls and Endwalls
- Good use of fill to elevate roadway
- Good use of crosspipe locations / good spacing / etc.

Recommendations

Most Common Recommendations:

- Technical recommendations on Stream crossings (71%)
 - Bankfull width or wider structure
 - Establish Bank Margins
 - Low Flow Channels
 - Limit Use Round Pipes
 - Longitudinal Profile
 - Seek Assistance from CDGRS / TU
 - Disconnect Drainage
- Attend Stream Crossing Training (50%)
- <u>Utilize /implement more / better pipe installation/</u> <u>shallow cross pipes (40%)</u>

Other Recommendations:

- QAB related items (31%)
 - Appoint Alternates
 - Attend Additional Training
 - Review SCC / Local policies / be familiar with them
 - Update local policy to be inline with program policy
- More Outreach and Education (24%)
- Don't use drop inlets on Dirt Road
- Fill across road profile "shoulder to shoulder" with no grade changes
- <u>4-6% crown on DSA placements</u>

Required Actions

Most Common Required Actions:

- Follow stream Crossing Policy / Stream Related Required Actions (80%)
 - Less than 100% bankfull pipes
 - Not designed and constructed to accommodate AOP
 - Application to small streams
 - Project not eligible for replacement / funded items outside of policy
- Off Right-of-Way (44%)
 - Written Landowner Permission
 - No Prior SCC Approval
 - Funded Off ROW items outside of policy

Other Required Actions:

- Training requirements:
 - Administrative training
 - ESM training
 - Additional stream crossing training
- More outreach and education is required
 - Equal access
- Prevailing Wage Documentation
- Full Depth Reclamation
 - <u>3rd party mix design</u>
 - Usually shallow grind, not FDR

Potential Changes for Round IV:

- Zoom interviews seemed to be successful
 - More participation than normal
 - More time to focus on field reviews
- View more under contract sites
- Would like to revamp the process
- Shorter, more "digestible" reports
 - Checklists? Forms?
 - More Pictures, less words?

Plan moving forward:

- Develop a QAQC Round IV Workgroup
- Develop a questionnaire to send to all Districts / field reps / QAB members to get input on how to improve the process
- Personal phone call from Justin to District staff to try to get additional feedback
- Start Round 4 as soon as possible
